- Increase the proportion of P-2 students achieving A or B in English from 18% (2021) to 30%.
- Increase the proportion of P-6 students achieving A or B in English from 22% (2021) to 30%.

Our initiatives include

- Embedding the use of learning walls in each classroom, with samples of student work aligned to the Marking Guide for the current English unit.
- Visits in every classroom each term with provision of feedback through 5 questions for students (Sharrat).
- Developing a whole of school approach to the gradual release model of writing including the pedagogies used for automaticity, modelled shared, guided and independent writing.
